

Zones is a curriculum geared toward helping students gain skills in consciously regulating their actions. Students explore calming techniques, strategies and sensory supports so they will have a toolbox of methods to move between zones. I can't wait for our hallways to once again be filled with the sounds of children! We are looking forward to a successful 2021-2022 school year.

Beginning of Year Reminders

• *Arrival*- Supervision is provided in the building beginning at 7:45 a.m. **Children** <u>should not</u> arrive to school prior to this time as there is NOT supervision in the building. If your child is dropped off early you will be contacted to pick them up.

• *Building Safety-* Please plan to drop your child off at the main entrance. Staff will be at the doors to greet students and get them where they need to go. All parents and visitors to Harding are expected to check in at the office and put on a visitors badge. Thank you for helping to keep the students at Harding safe. *Parents of preschool students will receive preschool specific communication from the Early Childhood teachers.

• *Student Absence*- Please call the attendance number at **421-4406** if your child will be absent from school. You will be contacted if we do not hear from you to be sure your child is safe. Students arriving to school late must check-in at the office before going to the classroom.

• *Bus Loading Zone*- To ensure the safety of our students, we ask that you do not park in the bus loading zones designated by the yellow curb and posted signs. This area is very busy from 7:30-8:15 a.m. and again from 2:45-3:30 p.m.

• *Personal Property*- Students are encouraged to leave personal items at home. Equipment for recess will be provided by the school.

COVID-19 Information



As of August 9, 2021 the Mason City School District will follow these updated health and safety guidelines/rules related to COVID-19

- All water bottle filling stations and drinking fountains will be operational.
- Signage regarding checking for symptoms will remain in the building.
- Entrance doors will remain locked and visitors should make an appointment or call at the door for admittance.
- Hand sanitizer and face coverings will be available at entry doors.
- Sanitizing stations will remain throughout each building.
- Building cleaning routines, schedules and procedures will remain in effect.
- Face coverings are recommended for all staff and students who are not vaccinated. It is not appropriate to ask people their vaccination status.
- Contact tracing and other related procedures related to a positive COVID test of staff and or students will continue.
