Introduction

The Mason City Public School believes all students can and will learn to be productive and responsible citizens. Therefore, young people need every available opportunity to increase their educational skills to prepare themselves for entry into our highly technical global community. In following this belief, the Board of Directors of the Mason City Community School District established the Alternative School in the fall of 1975. This school is an effort to establish educational options for students who were not achieving success in traditional school programs.

The Mason City Alternative School offers a flexible program of study with the opportunity for students to prepare for high school completion, higher education, entry into the military service, and job preparation. The Alternative School places emphasis on the basic academic skills as defined by the Iowa Core Curriculum and concentrates on career development. All instruction is geared toward moving students to their highest academic potential and greater competency for living in today's global community.

All students at the Alternative School are considered to possess the ability to function as adults in our overall society. Each student is allowed to construct and implement an individual plan of study that will meet his or her personal goals and aspirations. Students are expected to show increasing control over their own life and academic situations as they progress through school.

The total program is designed to meet the individual needs of students who require an option different from the traditional high school program in pursuing their academic and personal growth goals.

There are seven basic rules outlining appropriate behavior expected of a student who is enrolled in the Mason City Alternative School program. They serve as our Student/Parent Handbook. Each includes a list of specific items that can be further researched in the resource handbook available to you upon request. If there are specific rules you do not understand, please do not hesitate in requesting a resource handbook or talk to the program Principal directly. As an Alternative School student, you will be held responsible for violations of the seven basic rules.

It is the belief of the Mason City Alternative School staff that the following seven basic rules will help you as students in having a successful high school experience, and help you as parents guide your teenager through an important time in his/her life.
